- Winner of the "Greenest School on Earth" award in 2012, this is the perfect setting to become a student of sustainability.



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




MODEL UNITED NATIONS

Through this programme, students will fill the shoes of United Nations delegates, debating in the Model United Nations style and receiving training to become experts in thinking critically about sustainability and developing global policy solutions.

Model United Nations is a debate format where students take the role of national ambassadors to seek and solve global issues. Each student will represent a different country, and this will change throughout the camp so they can view problems from multiple global perspectives. Students will build a case on behalf of their country, becoming experts on their nation and public speaking specialists.

Save the World Summit:

Adults Have Tried and Failed

On the camp, students will solve the world's most pressing issues that are described under the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). Each day, the young delegates will tackle a different SDG and a specific, related problem. For example, the theme of a day may be SDG 6 "Clean Water and Sanitation" and students can debate the advantages and disadvantages of clean water supply chains, and engage hands-on with cleaning the local Balinese rivers.

1

Each student will join a small class of up to 10 peers and represent a country as part of the United Nations. Students will take on the mindset of a nation to understand how they may approach a global issue.

2

Each day, students will be given a new problem related to a UN sustainable development goal (SDG).

3

Students will be challenged to propose a policy that is consistent with their country's viewpoints, and then defend their case in a debate with other delegates.

4

At the end of the camp, each class will have a list of policies to save the world. Finally, the whole camp will come together to debate and vote on which class's resolutions should be passed at the Save the World Summit.

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Sustainable Development Goal 2: Zero Hunger	
Time	Activity
7:00	Wake Up
7:00-8:30	Communal Breakfast Preparation and Cooking Take turns to contribute to the Bali Green Camp community by preparing food.
8:30-9:00	Breakfast
9:00-12:00	Bamboo Raft Building Experience Bali, its people, and its culture through fun activities. Build bamboo rafts to travel downstream, combat other students in Balinese Archery, and climb to the top of coconut trees.
12:00-13:00	Lunch
13:00-14:00	Lesson 1 Learn about an SDG and an associated issue. In the case of SDG 2. Zero Hunger, the issue may be how you can help farmers cope with extreme weather.
14:00-15:00	Lesson 2 Appreciate your country and its attitude towards the issue to develop a consistent policy to solve the problem. For example, for dealing with extreme weather, the UK may push for a light policy since their climate is temperate, however, Ghana may come up with a create solution for dealing with drought.
15:00-16:00	Lesson 3 Nourish and develop debating and public speaking skills, such as putting together convincing arguments and speaking confidently.
16:00-17:00	Self-Study Write your speeches and develop your arguments.
17:00-18:00	Model UN Debate Debate to defend your country and the policy you have proposed. As a UN, vote to decide how to move forward together.
18:00-19:00	Dinner
19:00-21:00	Evening Activity Compete with other classes while enjoying more Balinese activities. Spot animals on the Camp Safari, dance in the traditional Balinese style, and tactically outsmart others in campfire games.
22:00	Lights Out

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


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
