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

THE SILVER PACKAGE

This is best suited to students that only want help with a specific part of the application. Students can select modules from those in the gold package. These are charged on an hourly basis.

For international applicants, we are also able to assist in booking language tests and have access to resources that will assist you in the process of applying for a visa.

- Specific dates will be organized on a rolling basis each month and mentoring will take place over Zoom with feedback reports provided after each session and additional documents and resources sent to the student via the full-time UAM team.










WHAT CAN OUR STUDENTS EXPECT?







STUDENT EXAMPLE

The documents shown are:

- **1. Personalized Application Plan** This is designed from the initial consultation and sessions may be added or changed based on what is most suitable for the student.
- 2. University and Subject Guide This will be given to the student after the first session and will give students 7-8 recommendations of universities they should look into further with information about them that comes from the mentor's experience as well as statistics from the university.
- **3.** Interview Question This would be used in a mock interview given by the mentor.

Session	Description	Post Session	
		Mentor will provide	Student will
Session 1 Initial Discussion	Student will meet with their mentor for the first time and some time will be spent trying to ascertain the student's goals and ambitions for the UAM and giving them an idea of what universities in the UK are like. The second half of the session will be spent discussing university and major choices. The mentor will get an idea of what the student would like from a university and major and what their current thoughts are. This will give the mentor enough information to create a personalised University and Major Guide ready to be discussed in the next session.	A university and major guide. This guide will contain information about recommended universities categorised into three levels; suitable, very safe and ambitious.	Read the guide provided by the mentor and write down any questions.
Session 2 In Depth Research	The session will be used to discuss the university and major guide that was created by the mentor. The student will be asked at the end of this session to do independent research if they wish using the resources provided in the guide in order to make an informed decision.	Any further information required to make their choices.	Select 5 universities and 1-2 majors they wish to apply for.
Session 3 Final Decisions and Suitability Checks	The student will come to the session with any final questions about his university and major choices. The student and mentor will rank the university and major choices in order of preference and suitability. A general discussion will be had about the entry requirements for the universities. If the student wishes to apply to Cambridge as was mentioned in the initial consultation college choice will also start to be discussed here. The discussion will continue while the UCAS form is filled in in later sessions.		Make their university and major choice.

Session 1 Academic Discussions	 The mentor will discuss the ways that they can boost their background ready to write the personal statement. Courses: Online and in person courses may be suggested. These can include online subject master classes and lecture series run by universities in the UK. Work experience - The mentor can recommend ways to find this work experience if it is needed. Session 1 Brainstorming	The mentor will provide the student with a list of application documents that will be needed for him to send off for their application including a personal statement and written references. A timeline will be established for these documents to be gathered or written. The mentor will then begin discussions on personal statement writing showing the student examples and creating a list of potential talking points.	An application document checklist will be sent along with example personal statements.	Create a first initial draft of their personal statement in rough format.
Session 2 to 3 Personal Statement Writing	The mentor will look at the draft that has been written and suggest amendments and work through improving it together. The student will then go away and make any more amendments before sending it back to the mentor. In between session two and three drafts of the statement may be sent to the mentor for any further comments to be added. The mentor will also check in on the process of written references and any other application documents that are required.	Marking and feedback of personal statement drafts.	Write Personal statement drafts and send them to his mentor.
Session 4 to 5 UCAS Application	The student will discuss with their mentor the most up-to-date draft of their personal statement and a final version will be written and agreed on. Session 2 Test Walk Through	A past paper will be provided for the admissions test the student needs to complete. Session 1 What is the Interview?	The mentor will inform the student of the format of the interview and walk them through how a typical interview will work. Session 2 to 4 Interview Question Walk Through	The mentor will walk the student through typical interview questions. The advice and assistance given by the mentor will start off very detailed and will slowly become less and less as the student becomes more confident in answering the questions. Session 5 to 6 Mock Interviews	The student will complete a mock interview on their chosen subject. This will replicate the style of a university interview and allow them to assess how they would perform in a real interview setting and become comfortable in the situation. The second session will mainly focus on feedback from this mock and final preparations. The mentor will also make sure the student is happy with the logistics of his interview and how it will run. Session 6 Final Session	This is the final official session with the mentor. Natural Sciences (NST) offers a wide range of physical and biological science subjects from 16 departments in a unique and demanding course. A broad first year is combined with increasing specialisation in the second year, and the possibility of total specialisation from the third year.

The breadth of the course reflects the blurring of boundaries between the different sciences and before committing yourself to one department you study a variety of subjects, some of which may be new to you. This means you can change your mind about which subject to specialise in.


